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Introduction

This 'roadmap for skills' sets out how the WMCA through the use of its Adult Education Budget (AEB) and working with partners, will support the growth of construction professionals across the region.

This regional plan mirrors our wider ambition for adult learning by providing a greater breadth of training at all levels, to not only those, who are looking to gain employment, but also for those, already in employment looking to develop their career or change their job.

We aim to ensure that the provisions offered will be flexible, whether it's full-time, part-time, onthe-job or off-the-job and appropriate, whether you are looking for your first ever job or looking to progress or change your career.

The plan has been developed in consultation with our training providers and regional employers and everyone will have the chance to retrain and update their skills to move into this growth sector.

Construction in the West Midlands

Construction is a significant part of the local economy and is a major employer in the WMCA area. It's a key enabler of economic growth and job creation and has a significant impact on enhancing the built environment, creating the facilities required in a modern economy and addressing the shortage of housing and employment facilities.

Across the WMCA, there are a large number of construction projects planned and underway, ranging from HS2 to new homes. The construction sector will need to go further to meet its ambitions and this will include, embracing the digital and technological opportunities, improving skills and developing more intelligent commissioning and procurement systems.

A healthier, fairer recovery

Our Recharge the West Midlands vision includes the ambition to increase the innovation in healthcare in the West Midlands through the acceleration of high-growth sectors to address the productivity gap, improve health outcomes and reduce regional health inequalities. The development of internationally recognised health technologies would increase the opportunities for residents.

Our community recovery prospectus equally sets out our approach to levelling up the West Midlands post pandemic and has six priorities – the things that are most important to our residents:

- Living safely with Coronavirus
- Accessing healthcare and improving physical health
- Mental health support
- Education and young people
- Jobs and training
- Local business and high streets

The construction sector plays a critical role across all of these and improving the skills of those who work in it and those seeking to work in it will aid our recovery.


We know that young people, people from BAME communities, those working on the front line and those generally worse off in our society are disproportionately affected by COVID. Improved skill levels will, for many, improve their job prospects and earnings. The construction sector can lead the way in making this a reality.

What is the ambition?

The ambition of the regional construction plan is to develop a regional offer that enables practical points of entry for those new to the sector and also provides a seamless workforce development and career progression pathway.

The plan aims to move residents into critical roles in the region, heightened by the pandemic and will go some way to tackle the region's unemployment, but also to raise awareness of the opportunities within these employment sectors.

Through a cohesive approach between training providers and the employers, it is envisaged that the training will truly meet the needs and specialities of the employers, whilst providing individuals with opportunities to grow and develop.



What will we do?

We will increase the pathways and qualifications offered through AEB to match the jobs available.

WMCA already spends £8m of its devolved adult education budget on construction training and qualifications. Access is good across the region with 19 colleges and providers delivering WMCA designed Construction Gateway as well as individual qualifications, thereby, extending the range of training available to cover current and emerging occupations.

Currently, training is offered during the working day on a full-time basis which limits participation.

However, due to the pandemic, we have seen a more flexible approach being adopted by the sector with training being delivered online as well as on-site, supporting a blended learning approach.

We want to build on this experience and widen participation by offering more training utilising both, online and on-site training, hosted by regional projects so that, those in work, those with family or those with caring and other commitments, will still be able to fit training around their busy lives.

We will:

- Widen participation by offering more flexible learning options (part-time, accelerated, blended etc.)
- Increase the number of people in work accessing training and qualifications to improve their pay
- Increase the number and breadth of Construction Gateway programmes
- Offer ESOL for Construction courses through community learning providers and colleges
- Enhance participation in training and employment opportunities for BAME and female residents

Work with further education colleges, training providers and universities to increase pathways to higher education

• To align the college and training provider

offer to allow progression to regional universities, ensuring our construction colleges work in collaboration to plan and deliver a robust training offer across the region and pathways

• To work with colleges to ensure their offer meets the regional skills demand in the sector.

Work with regional partners to develop a complementary training offer

- Align the AEB offer alongside Apprenticeships and the CITB grant levy funded training to deliver a comprehensive training offer
- Work with DWP JCP (Job Centre Plus) to offer all young people additional construction training to prepare them for jobs or apprenticeships
- Work with all sub contract partners of DWP to support those long-term unemployed looking to work in the construction sector
- Work with partners to improve referral arrangements and wrap around support for adults looking to progress into the construction sector - from entry level to higher level skills
- Develop ESOL for Construction programme so that it is accessible across the region

Work with employers, Local Authorities and anchor networks to increase opportunities for disadvantaged groups such as:

- Young people
- Young people who are NEET (Not in Education, Employment or Training)
- Residents in low paid work
- Lived experience
- Women
- Social value commitments
- Anchor network employers
- Disabled young people
- Long-term unemployed
- Recently made redundant

Routes into Construction

With so many ways to enter a career in construction, it can be difficult to know where to start. Go Construct Routes Into Construction | Go Construct have put together some information on the main routes into the industry to help you figure out which is right for you.

Earn a wage whilst learning a specific job

- Take 1 5 years to complete
- Start your career straight out of school
- Time split between your employer and training provider
- Focus is on learning hands-on skills relating to a specific job role
- Over 100 roles can be entered through apprenticeships, with more being added
- Earn as you learn, with no tuition fees

Blend classroom learning with a work based placement

- Courses last two years
- You'll gain a technical qualification
- A minimum of 45 days is spent in industry placements
- Choose from around 25 varied courses
- No tuition fees

Study for an academic or vocational degree

- Full-time degrees take 3-4 years to complete

CSCS Cards


CSCS cards provide proof that individuals working on construction sites, have the appropriate training and qualifications for the job they do on site. By ensuring the workforce are appropriately qualified the card plays its part in improving standards and safety on UK construction sites.

Holding a CSCS card is not a legislative requirement. It is entirely up to the principal contractor or client whether workers are required to hold a card before they are allowed on site. However, most principal contractors and major house builders require construction workers on their sites to hold a valid card.

CSCS cards come in 6 colours

- Green Labourer
- Red Temporary cards for those who are not qualified but in the process of achieving a recognised qualification
- Blue Skilled Worker
- Gold Advanced craft/Supervisory
- Black Manager
- White Academic or Professional qualified person

Each have their own training requirements including a relevant CITB Health, Safety and Environment test or training course to completed as well. Visit CSCS <u>https://www.cscs.uk.com/</u> for more information.



Reignite your future

Sector Based Work Academy Programmes (SWAPs)

Delivered in conjunction with employers who are recruiting, completing a SWAP will help you apply for a job in a new area of work. Work placements and employer support will help you develop your immediate and future skills needs, enabling you to gain employment. You could be back into work in no time and whilst you are retraining, you will not lose your benefits!

Technical Training (free level 3 courses)

In conjunction with partners, we have identified sectors that are continuing to grow and increase their workforce despite the impact of Covid-19. We have worked with Colleges West Midlands to develop a range of free qualifications that offer technical training in construction and other industries that will enhance your education level and increase your skills so that you can pursue a career in those growth priority sectors. They are free, part-time courses that will enable you to upskill whilst you continue to work.
